On November 24th at the Country Club Plaza, Security Officer Scott Miles observed a vehicle parked in a no parking zone outside a store and observed two suspicious parties exit the vehicle and enter the store. He conducted a walk through of the store at that time and was able to alert managers of the store that one of the suspects was stuffing merchandise into an empty bag. When the suspects realized they were being watched by S/O Miles and store managers, they dropped the bag and exited the store. The bag was found to have over \$300 in merchandise in it.

On November 24th while on bicycle patrol on the Country Club Plaza, Security Officer Brandon Meyer observed a patron hand three bills to a Salvation Army Bell Ringer.
