Employee Salutes

"Salute" awards are presented to employees who go the extra mile in their roles within Chesley Brown International. We recognize many actions performed by officers in the normal course of a day go unnoticed. The following were recognized in this month's Chairman's Chat:

On 5-9-10 on the Country Club Plaza, Security Officer David Rodriguez found a vehicle that had just been broken into. Due to his quick actions, a suspect was able to be identified and stopped by an off-duty KCMO Police Officer. Assistant Director Lisa Offield was later able to review CCTV and identify the suspect and provide video to the KCPD Property Crimes Unit. Police Detectives questioned and followed the suspect and reported back that to date it appears that "He seems to be afraid to return to the Plaza."

On 5-4-10 at White Provision, Officer Jeremy Turner heard glass shattering on the first level of the parking garage. He observed two black males peering in to two vehicles parked side by side. He immediately dialed 911. Both suspects spotted him coming and began running up towards the next level. One suspect was carrying a silver laptop computer, later found to have been taken from one of the vehicles. He blew his whistle several times as he pursued the suspects to level two. Both men entered a gray mini van with Georgia tag BJX 0794. They began driving back towards level one and made an attempt to run him over, forcing him to jump on to the trunk of a nearby vehicle to avoid being struck. While still in contact with 911 dispatch, he relayed the license plate and suspect descriptions, including that a third person could be seen in the vehicle. As the suspects exited the rear gated driveway they continued north on to Brady Avenue. He stopped pursuing at that time, as two Atlanta Police vehicles arrived on the scene.
